Moving into Flatlanders is a relational process - we need to get to know each other before we can decide if it's a good fit.

Our administrator will walk you through the application process:

- Set-up an INNtake appointment with our administrator
- Come for dinner so we can meet and get to know each other
- Fill out application form and come for an interview
- Learn about community living and discuss goals
- The process can take a couple months

We are always accepting applications. Sometimes there is a waiting list but things can change quickly. Community living isn't for everyone! It takes time for fit to become clear, and for applicants to know if Flatlanders is what they really want. This is why the application process can't be rushed.

Our Values

Flatlanders Inn is a transitional housing place for people at risk of homelessness, as well as a community of people who live intentionally and purposefully in the North End of Winnipeg. We have been home to many people since 2007--some have come and gone, others have remained connected in one way or another.

We value relationship and being open and honest with each other. We know this isn't always normal, but if we are going to help each other live healthy lives and find healing, we will need the support of others. We also value our faith. Not everyone who lives at Flatlanders models their lives after Jesus, but the core of the community is built on his teachings. Our faith effects all areas of our lives, such as how we deal with conflict, what we do with our bodies, and how we treat others and the earth. As you can see, our faith is not limited to Sundays!

Flatlanders Inn is made up of transitional members (who stay an average of 6-18 months, but this can be indefinite), and leadership team members. The leadership team members are a part of the community on a long-term basis, and are responsible to lead and guide Flatlanders. Together we are working to create a supportive environment that goes beyond simply providing a place to stay.
